The English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

The EBacc is a set of subjects (not a qualification) at GCSE that keeps young people's options open for further study and future careers. The EBacc is made up of these subjects:

Work Experience 9th-20th November 2020

- The work experience process will start in March 2020
- Work experience is for 2 weeks and takes place in November 2020, by then students will be in Year 10
- As a school we work with a business partner called *EBP South*. They carry out all the necessary health and safety checks to enable students to undertake work experience safely
- In March 31st 2020, students will be given a presentation about work experience and how to use the EBP online system.



Own Placements



Option 1

- Own placements can be sourced by approaching an employer directly .
- The Own placement forms can be accessed on the school website ,the Careers Department and Tutors.
- Once a placement is secured a consent form ***must*** be completed and returned to ***Mrs Gough***



EBP South Work Placements

Option 2

- Students can apply on EBP South employer website (however *students are often more successful by approaching an employer directly.*
- *Sourcing a placement **on-line** can be a slow process)*
- *Make at least 4 choices per time*
- *Time scale:*
- *Allow 30 days for EBP to make contact with employer since the time that you have applied.*
- *EBP can take 35-70 days in total to gain a work placement as paper work and checks have to be made.*
- An employer consent form can be printed on the EBP website to confirm work placement.



Finding a work placement

- When sourcing work experience it is important to think about any career aspirations or interests
- Talk to family, friends and business contacts for advice. Find out if anyone can offer a 2 week placement in November

Charges

CHARGES THAT CAN BE INCURRED DURING WORK EXPERIENCE

- Once an employer has accepted a student for a placement;
- If you do not accept the placement, a charge of £35 will be incurred by Parents/Carers.
- If you wish to change a placement, a charge of £35 will be incurred by Parents/Carers.
- You cannot apply for an “own placement” and an EBP placement online at the same time.



Charges

- Please ensure your daughter only chooses occupational areas that she is genuinely interested in and that the employer she chooses is in a location she able to travel to and from.
- All work experience arrangements must be finalised by **29th May 2020**.
